# Some medieval Keresley Families

The medieval population of Keresley has been estimated to be around 30 people in ten or more houses - this is an attempt to outline some of those families. The sources are the "Calendar of Deeds and Documents of Queen's College Oxford" Vol. II, compiled in 1931 by N. Denholm-Young, and deeds in the Coventry City Council, recording land transactions. These refer to many classes of people, from 'lord' to serf. There would have been some people not mentioned, or mentioned in deeds which have been lost. The families are 'of Keresley' in that they are actually living here, rather than just holding land.

Spellings are variable. For example the Bulbek family is recorded as Bolebec, Bulbek and Bulebec.

The great majority are male, because women or 'maidens' could not in general hold land. They are mostly mentioned as a widow or a maiden transferring their land.

A definite date like 1290 is the actual date of the deed. A range like 1280-89 means some time within these limits. A lot happened in 1294 - possibly the death of Thomas de Keresley.

Only one member, William, in 1348 - the peak of the Black Death. There was a medieval Jannylane.

### Heyne

The Heyne family gives its name to le Haynelane, the footpath now called Hen Lane, which marks the northern boundary of the City

## **Northcroft**

There are more mentions of the Northcroft family than any other. They have a confusing habit of calling themselves William. There were places called Northcrofthead and NorthcroftEnd.

# **Flecchere**

Richard the fletcher, husband of Amice, was around in 1349 - the Black Death

## The Tailor

Adam has no surname, other than 'the Taylor', and also sutor, or cobbler. He was around before 1294. In 1295 his widow Alice grants their 4 furrows to Gilbert Kenno of Fillongley, because she cannot hold land. But Roger Northcroft grants her 6 strips to live on. Thomas is Adam's son.

### de le Hul

'from the hill'. Sometime before 1294, Thomas de Keresley grants his serf Thomas de le Hul to his son Adam. A lord could do anything with a serf short of maiming or killing them. They could be sold, as here. Richard del hul in 1327 and 1340 is probably his son. Richard super le hul in 1339 is probably the same person
